Our Sanctuary:

Those who designed and built our facility gave us a great gift in the stained glass windows which line the walls of our sanctuary. Blue is the dominant color which presents a theme of water. (We are in Roaring Spring.) Jesus is the Living Water who alone can satisfy our souls.

The windows on the north side of the sanctuary depict Old Testament passages of Scripture which have reference to water -- Noah's flood, Abraham's servant meeting Rebekah at a well, Elijah having the altar doused with water before the sacrifice which defeated the prophets of Baal, Jonah and the big fish, and so on.

The south wall contains depictions of New Testament events with one set representing present day ministry. Among the accounts represented are the baptism of Jesus, Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding in Cana, the water that mixed with blood and flowed from Jesus' side on the cross, the commission Christ gave the church to baptize, the turbulent seas of the Apostle Paul's shipwrecks, and so forth.

They remind us that the story of the Bible, though written over the course of two thousand years, is tied together with a single plotline of the redemption that God has worked for His people through Jesus who has washed and cleansed us and is leading us home to heaven.
