Moments of Concern

Call to Worship: *Psalm 34:3* – Oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt His name together.

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 16 (pages 16-17)

- Q. Why did Christ have to go all the way to death?
 - A. Because God's justice and truth demand it: only the death of God's Son could pay for our sin.
- Q. Why was He buried?
 - A. His burial testifies that He really died.
- Q. Since Christ has died for us, why do we still have to die?
 - A. Our death does not pay the debt of our sins. Rather, it puts an end to our sinning and is our entrance into eternal life.
- Q. What further advantage do we receive from Christ's sacrifice and death on the cross?
 - A. Through Christ's death our old selves are crucified, put to death, and buried with Him, so that the evil desires of the flesh may no longer rule us, but that instead we may dedicate ourselves as an offering of gratitude to Him.
- Q. Why does the creed add: "He descended into hell"?
 - A. To assure me in times of personal crisis and temptation that Christ my Lord, by suffering unspeakable anguish, pain, and terror of soul, especially on the cross but also earlier, has delivered me from the anguish and torment of hell.

*Hymn of Adoration: 323 Holy! Holy! Holy! Lord God Almighty Call to Confession: Psalm 51:16-17 – For You do not desire sacrifice, or else I would give it; You do not delight in burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart—these, O God, You will not despise.

Prayer of Confession: Father in heaven, forgive us for we have not loved our Savior as He has loved us. Even though we have been

purchased at the price of His blood, we have continued in the ways of the flesh. We have failed to consider ourselves crucified with Christ. We have broken Your laws and rebelled against our calling to offer ourselves in gratitude to our Savior. Have mercy on us. Give us grace that we might live the new life Jesus gives us. We pray in His Name. Amen.

Agnus Dei:

All: O Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, grant us your peace. Amen.
