"Therefore turn and live!" **Prayer of Confession:** Father in heaven, the high ransom price of the blood of Your Son, Jesus, was paid for us, and yet we have failed to live the new life of righteousness and self-sacrifice and joy and love and mercy even though Your Word tells us that we have been made alive in Christ. Nor have we properly set our desires on heaven where Christ is bringing us and has promised to reward us. We have failed to serve others with the new life Christ has gifted us. Forgive our faithlessness and cleanse us of it. We offer our plea in the name of Jesus who gave Himself that we might live. Amen.

Men: O Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us.

All: O Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, grant us your peace. Amen.

Assurance of Pardon: Isaiah 53:4-5 – Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.

- ⁴ But as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, even so we speak, not as pleasing men, but God who tests our hearts.

- ⁵ For neither at any time did we use flattering words, as you know, nor a cloak for covetousness—God is witness.
- ⁶ Nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, when we might have made demands as apostles of Christ.
- ⁷ But we were gentle among you, just as a nursing mother cherishes her own children.
- ⁸ So, affectionately longing for you, we were well pleased to impart to you not only the gospel of God, but also our own lives, because you had become dear to us.
- *Gospel Lesson: Luke 7:47 Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little.
