Call to Worship: *Psalm 2:12* – Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and you perish in the way, when His wrath is kindled but a little. Blessed are all those who put their trust in Him.

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 19 (page 18)

- Q. Why the next words: "and sits at the right hand of God"?
 - A. Christ ascended to heaven, there to show that He is head of His church, and that the Father rules all things through Him.
- Q. How does this glory of Christ our head benefit us?
 - A. First, through His Holy Spirit He pours out His gifts from heaven upon us His members. Second, by His power He defends us and keeps us safe from all enemies.
- Q. How does Christ's return "to judge the living and the dead" comfort you?
 - A. In all my distress and persecution I turn my eyes to the heavens and confidently await as judge the very One who has already stood trial in my place before God and so has removed the whole curse from me. All His enemies and mine He will condemn to everlasting punishment: but me and all His chosen ones He will take along with Him into the joy and the glory of heaven.

- ¹³ Therefore thus says the Lord God: "Behold, My servants shall eat, but you shall be hungry; behold, My servants shall drink, but you shall be thirsty; behold, My servants shall rejoice, but you shall be ashamed;
- ¹⁴ Behold, My servants shall sing for joy of heart, but you shall cry for sorrow of heart, and wail for grief of spirit.
- *Epistle Lesson: 1 Thessalonians 2:4-5, 13-16
- ⁴ But as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, even so we speak, not as pleasing men, but God who tests our hearts.
- ⁵ For neither at any time did we use flattering words, as you know, nor a cloak for covetousness—God is witness.
- ¹³ For this reason we also thank God without ceasing, because when you received the word of God which you heard from us, you welcomed it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which also effectively works in you who believe.
- For you, brethren, became imitators of the churches of God which are in Judea in Christ Jesus. For you also suffered the same things from your own countrymen, just as they did from the Judeans,
- who killed both the Lord Jesus and their own prophets, and have persecuted us; and they do not please God and are contrary to all men,
- ¹⁶ forbidding us to speak to the Gentiles that they may be saved, so as always to fill up the measure of their sins; but wrath has come upon them to the uttermost.
