Moments of Concern

Call to Worship: *Revelation 5:9-10* – And they sang a new song, saying:

"You are worthy to take the scroll, and to open its seals; for You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your blood out of every tribe and tongue and people and nation, and have made us kings and priests to our God; and we shall reign on the earth."

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 18 (pages 17-18)

- Q. What do you mean by saying, "He ascended into heaven"?
 - A. That Christ, while His disciples watched, was lifted up from the earth into heaven and will be there for our good until He comes again to judge the living and the dead.
- Q. But isn't Christ with us until the end of the world as He promised us?
 - A. Christ is true man and true God. In His human nature Christ is not now on earth; but in His divinity, majesty, grace, and Spirit He is not absent from us for a moment.
- Q. If His humanity is not present wherever His divinity is, then aren't the two natures of Christ separated from each other?
 - A. Certainly not. Since divinity is not limited and is present everywhere, it is evident that Christ's divinity is surely beyond the bounds of the humanity He has taken on, but at the same time His divinity is in and remains personally united to His humanity.
- Q. How does Christ's ascension into heaven benefit us?
 - A. First, He pleads our cause in heaven in the presence of His Father. Second, we have our own flesh in heaven a guarantee that Christ our head will take us, His members, to Himself in heaven. Third, He sends His spirit to us on earth as a further guarantee. By the Spirit's power we make the goal of our lives,

not earthly things, but the things above where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand.

*Hymn of Adoration: 349 "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing" Call to Confession: Ezekiel 18:30-32 "Therefore I will judge you, O house of Israel, every one according to his ways," says the Lord God. "Repent, and turn from all your transgressions, so that iniquity will not be your ruin. For I have no pleasure in the death of one who dies," says the Lord God. We have lived lives of doubt, not being willing to give ourselves freely in service, and we have not given ourselves to You in love by walking in a manner worthy of the calling we have received to participate in Your kingdom and glory. Cleanse us and teach us to imitate our holy Savior. We pray in the Name of Jesus who intercedes for us this day. Amen.
