Moments of Concern

Call to Worship: Psalm 100:1-3 — Make a joyful shout to the LORD, all you lands! Serve the LORD with gladness; come before His presence with singing. Know that the LORD, He is God; it is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people and the sheep of His pasture.

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 26 (page 22)

- Q. How does baptism remind you and assure you that Christ's one sacrifice on the cross is for you personally?
 - A. In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing and with it gave the promise that, as surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly His blood and His Spirit wash away my soul's impurity, in other words, all my sins.
- Q. What does it mean to be washed with Christ's blood and Spirit?
- A. To be washed with Christ's blood means that God, by grace, has forgiven my sins because of Christ's blood poured out for me in His sacrifice on the cross. To be washed with Christ's Spirit means that the Holy Spirit has renewed me and set me apart to be a member of Christ so that more and more I become dead to sin and increasingly live a holy and blameless life.
- Q. Where does Christ promise that we are washed with His blood and Spirit as surely as we are washed with the water of baptism?
 - A. In the institution of baptism where He says: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." "He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe will be condemned." This promise is repeated when Scripture calls baptism the washing of regeneration and the washing away of sins.

Call to Confession: Isaiah 55:7 – Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the Lord, and He will have mercy on him; and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon.
Prayer of Confession: Father in heaven, we lack the faith to believe that we have been cleansed from sin by Christ's blood and Spirit, and so we have not made proper effort to put to death our old natures and to die to sin. We have failed both to recognize how wicked our sins truly are and to realize how precious is the washing and the new life we have received. Forgive us and grant us grace to live courageous lives of praise, glorifying You before the world. We pray in the Name of Jesus who shed His blood so we could be pardoned. Amen.


